At the White House correspondents dinner earlier this month, he wore a red, red, red tie — and later lamented that he had to wear it “over the red meat stains.” No, seriously. Obama's relationship with red, the preferred color of the Republican party, runs deep. Back in the early '80s, when Obama was campaigning as a newly elected state senator in Chicago, he was outspent by a Republican opponent on signs that read, “Remember the Maine.” ADVERTISEMENT The Democrat won. And in 2007, when Obama was running for president, his vice presidential running mate, then-Sen. Joe Biden, signed a four-year lease on a \$5-million, 9,000-square-foot apartment building in Washington that was completely red, a color that the then-vice president called “a tough color to live with.” But Obama found a way to love that color — and to harness it. That's the big question: Why has he made so many Republican mistakes? In the '80s, he aligned himself with his home state's Democratic Sen. Dick Durbin (Ill.), and not with the incumbent Republican senator, who carried Illinois. In the '90s, he chose to shake hands with Democratic Rep. Dan Burton of Indiana, a conservative on an important and controversial issue of the time, abortion. ADVERTISEMENT This year, he chose to spend several days in the Rust Belt states of Ohio and Wisconsin with a Democratic governor and Democratic senators running for reelection. And in the White House correspondents dinner — where Obama got three of the biggest laughs — he called “Joe” the political press secretary, Joe Biden, the following day, mocking the vice president's birth name, “Joseph.” (Oh, I'm going to be so bored with this.)
